LM is often described as a "benign" lesion and is accepted as a melanoma in situ; LM can undergo malignant transformation to particularly aggressive melanoma.

Fortunately, for patients with the lentigo maligna (LM) subtype of melanoma in situ, there is overall good prognosis. The challenge of LM, however, is that it has the highest rate of local recurrence (approximately 20%) of all melanoma subtypes when treated by standard surgical excision alone, 1 owing to frequent, unpredictable, subclinical extension.

Lentigo maligna/lentigo maligna melanoma (LM/LMM) affects chronically sun-damaged skin of the head and neck with a slow radial growth phase. It is characterised by predominantly lentiginous proliferation of small, but atypical melanocytes with occasional upward scatter in an atrophic epidermis.
